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Daley overseas another week amid Olympic flap

Alderfolk and others who want to question Mayor Richard M. Daley about his big new financial guarantee for the 2016 Olympics are going to have to wait awhile.

On the heels of meeting with the International Olympic Committee in Lausanne, Switzerland, the mayor is headed to Amman, Jordan, for a meeting with chief executives of other cities around the world. He won't be back in town and available to the media or aldermen until next Thursday.

The mayor's spokeswoman swears the Jordanian trip has long been scheduled, and I believe her. But it sure is a lovely coincidence, 'cause now Mr. Daley will have a week for everything to cool off.

The spokeswoman did say that Chicago 2016 boss Pat Ryan or another official from the city's bid committee is prepared to testify before the City Council, if asked.
